The National Skills Development Study found that Tanzania needs to increase the number of young people entering key professions to reach its goal of becoming a middle income country. Some increases needed are:

ENGINEERING, **SCIENCE &** MANUFACTURING





INFORMATION & COMMUNICATION **TECHNOLOGIES**



The sectors they are most interested to work in are:

> **Healthcare** (23%)

> > Army or Police (10%)

Creative or Media (8%)

Business or Entrepreneurship (18%)

Pilot or Astronaut (13%)

Teaching (11%)

This is good news for closing the gap in healthcare professionals (and aerospace!)... but worrying for other key professions, especially in the fields of engineering, manufacturing and ICT.


